ABOUT MID-AMERICA

Mane Event is produced by Mid-America Horse Show Association, a non-profit Illinois corporation founded in 1939. Mid-America is one of the largest charter clubs of the American Saddlebred Horse Association with more than 400 members who own and compete with Saddlebreds, Roadster Horses and Hackney Ponies. The organization produces three shows a year and oversees a regional circuit of 35 affiliated A and B rated shows (in Illinois and surrounding states) where members earn points toward custom-designed year-end awards.

OFFICIAL PHOTOGRAPHER

Shiflet Photography is Official Photographer of the Mid-America Mane Event Horse Show. As such, it has **exclusive rights to the sale of photographs** taken of competitions and any other activities held in the Coliseum show ring. Doug Shiflet will be shooting from the floor of the show ring and an associate will be shooting authorized "over the rail" photos from the seats.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

HORSE SHOW OFFICE HOURS

The horse show office will close one hour before each performance. Entries for classes within a performance should be made prior to that closing. Check posted hours for additional closings.

EXPRESS CHECK-IN: Tuesday 10am-5pm and Wednesday 9am-noon for exhibitors whose entries are complete. Incomplete entries will not be processed during Express Check-In.

\$20 CHARGE FOR INCOMPLETE ENTRIES: Entries not containing all necessary documents to verify eligibility for horse/rider/owner/trainer/handler will be considered incomplete. Copies of registration papers showing proof of current ownership or lease, copies of current USEF, ASHA and AHHA membership cards must accompany entry blanks, which must include the REQUIRED three signatures and complete addresses for owners and trainers.

FAILURE TO ENTER/SCRATCH: A \$25 fine will be charged to any exhibitor who fails to enter or fails to scratch an entry at least one hour prior to the start of the performance in which the entry would compete.

STABLING: Stalls will be available Tuesday, October 20. Earlier stabling is an additional \$10/day/stall. Unless a horse is entered, it may not occupy a stall until all competition horses are accommodated.

PRIZE MONEY DISTRIBUTION:

\$500 – \$150/\$125/\$100/\$75/\$50; \$100 – \$30/\$25/\$20/\$15/\$10

STAKE/CHAMPIONSHIP ELIGIBILITY: To be eligible to compete in a divisional stake or championship, a horse or equitation rider must have shown and been judged in any class in that division providing both horse and rider met qualifications for championship. For an Amateur Stake, a horse must have been shown in any preliminary by an Amateur rider, for a Junior Exhibitor Stake by a Junior Exhibitor, and for a Ladies Stake by a Lady.

US EQUESTRIAN FEDERATION MEMBERSHIP STATEMENT
LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS PROVIDED THE RESPECTIVE BREED/DISCIPLINE DUES OR BREED/DISCIPLINE CATEGORY FEE HAS BEEN PAID. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, AGENT, COACH OR TRAINER AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A \$20.00 NON-MEMBER REGISTRATION FEE AND A \$5.00 BREED/DISCIPLINE CATEGORY FEE FOR EACH BREED/DISCIPLINE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE; 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (Academy classes are classes limited to horses used regularly in a lesson program). Whether member or non-member, all amateurs must possess an Amateur Card issued by USEF. Back numbers will not be released until entry blank has all signatures and all required credentials have been verified by horse show office.

OUT-OF-STATE HORSES: Horses coming into Illinois must have a Health Certificate and Entry Permit Number. Permit numbers are free, available 24/7 and good for 30 days, but must be obtained by your veterinarian from the Illinois Department of Agriculture at 217/782-4944. Or online at www.agr.state.il.us/AnimalHW/equinereg.html

UPHA CLASSICS: Open to any horse nominated and kept eligible with UPHA. Money will be added to entry fees collected and dispersed to winners in each Classic.

GRAND NATIONAL PROGRAM – THREE CLASSES OFFERED – TOTAL \$8,600: \$5,000 Fine Harness Stake plus \$1,800 Five Gaited Amateur Stake and Western Pleasure Stake classes. Prize distribution is split equally among Owner, Original Recorder and Sire Nominator. In \$5,000 class, 1st place money is \$833 (to each); 2nd place money is \$500 (to each); and 3rd place money is \$333 (to each). In \$1,800 classes, 1st place money is \$300 (to each); 2nd place money is \$200 (to each); and 3rd place money is \$100 (to each).

MID-AMERICA CLASS ELIGIBILITY: To qualify to show in any of the six new Mid-America classes, owners and riders or drivers must be current Mid-America Horse Show Association members and horses must have competed in the same class (either qualifying or championship) at either this year's Mid-America Spring Show or Mid-America Signature Show.

ASHA HEART OF AMERICA REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS: The American Saddlebred Horse Association has named Mid-America Mane Event a Regional Championship show and 23 classes are designated as Regional Championships (marked with a bullet [•] on the class schedule). The Regional Champion will be determined by the highest placing qualified horse, which will receive a neck ribbon, championship ribbon and take a victory pass.

HOW HORSE QUALIFIES: Horse must compete and receive a ribbon (1st through 8th) in the same section (qualifying class or championship) within the Saddlebred division in three separate competitions within Region 5 (Illinois, Missouri, Kansas, Colorado) between October 27, 2008 and October 21, 2009. Competitions need not be USEF but must be listed and results recorded in the ASHA database of competitions. (To check if a horse's wins are listed in the ASHA database, visit www.saddlebred.com and click on Competitions.) Owner of horse must be current member of ASHA. If a horse has been sold during the qualifying period, the records go with the horse.

Visit <http://www.saddlebred.com/RegChamp09Guide> for complete guidelines for 2009. A horse may earn only one Regional Championship title in a given calendar year. Once it wins a Regional Championship title, it no longer is eligible for additional titles even if it is qualified and competes at subsequent Regional Championship competitions. Conversely, if a horse competes in a Regional Championship class and does not win the Regional

Championship title, it may compete for a Regional Championship title at other Regional Championship competitions for which it is eligible.

Declaration of region is not required in 2009.

ALL DOGS MUST BE LEASHED

NOVICE AMATEUR RIDER: Not a USEF class. This class is open to riders who have not won three blue ribbons in any under-saddle class at a show recognized by Mid-America Horse Show Association or any other show-sanctioning organization.

COLISEUM ARENA is 116' x 240'; footing is sand and sawdust on clay.
Covered Warm-up Arena is 250' x 200'; footing is sand on clay.

HOLD HARMLESS STATEMENT: Any and all entries in this horse show shall be conditioned upon the following terms and conditions: The Mid-America Mane Event Horse Show, Mid-America Horse Show Association, Illinois Dept. of Agriculture, show management, and sponsors will be in no case responsible for any loss, damage or injury that may occur, and it shall be a condition of entry that each exhibitor shall hold them blameless for any loss or injury which may occur by fire, theft or otherwise.

“PROGRESSIVE PARTY” – SATURDAY NIGHT: If you would like to participate in the “Progressive Party” being organized for Saturday night, please check the box on the entry blank and we will contact you with information about local sources for party food and supplies. The show will distribute a stations menu showing the participating barns as well as the food specialty being offered by each barn.

GOLF CART RENTALS: Golf carts are available for rent at \$45 per day from the Illinois Department of Agriculture, but **must be reserved in advance.** Personal golf carts require a fairgrounds permit (\$10 per event). To rent a cart or get a permit for a personal cart, contact Terry Park at 217/782-1689 or email: terry.park@illinois.gov

MINOR MUST HAVE DRIVER'S LICENSE: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles on the competition grounds of recognized competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. Violations of this rule will be cause for sanctions against the parent(s), guardian(s) and/or trainer(s) who are responsible for the child committing the offense. Penalties may include exclusion of the child, parent(s), guardian(s), and/or trainer(s) from the competition grounds for the remainder of the competition and charges being filed against any of the above individuals in accordance with Rule 6. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

CAMPER PARKING: The Fairgrounds has a designated area for camper and motor home parking that includes complete hook-ups. Fee is \$25 per day and will be collected by Fairgrounds security at the camper parking site. (No camper parking is allowed anywhere else on the Fairgrounds.)

DIRECTIONS TO FAIRGROUNDS: The Fairgrounds is on the north side of Springfield. Exit I-55 at Sangamon Avenue West exit. Continue on Sangamon, which runs along the south side of the Fairgrounds.

• A meeting of riders, trainers and parents will be held at the show to insure that class competition and award ceremony procedures are understood by all.

• An elimination class may be scheduled if number of entries warrant.

• Participants must display neck ribbon on horse during individual entry into ring. Ribbons will then be removed before competition begins.

WORKOUT: Top 10 riders in each age group are required to do a workout. 13 and Under, USEF tests 1-12; 14-17 Years and Adults, USEF tests 1-16 (except adults not required to drop stirrups).

“GOOD HANDS” National Horse Show Finals

Open to riders who have not reached their 18th birthday and have qualified by winning a Good Hands qualifying class (requires minimum of three riders). For Good Hands qualification requirements see the USEF rule book. Enter only if qualified. The Finals consists of two sections: Preliminary and Championship. The Preliminary class(es) shall also serve as an elimination for the Championship and both consist of two phases – Phase 1 is rail work; Phase 2 is the mandatory workout (figure 8 at the canter, trot back to the judges, stop and back).

Judging is based 40% on rail work and 60% on workout.

From the Preliminary, judges shall select 10-15 riders to compete in the Championship, where a minimum of 8 riders will be selected for the Phase 2 workout. Further testing of any rider may be requested at the judges' discretion.
